Intended Use	<p>Healthcare entities will need to define health conditions and corresponding ICD-9 and ICD-10 code sets to inform a number of business and operational requirements including policies, benefits, analytics and reporting, testing, and other activities associated with the ICD-10 transition.</p> <p>The example Excel files provide a foundation for defining health conditions and corresponding, natively mapped ICD-9 and ICD-10 code sets; healthcare entities should modify the documents to align with the needs of their specific organization.</p>

Mapping Convention	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Codes were selected where the described meaning of the code corresponded with the definition and inclusion criteria and did not violate the exclusion criteria, • Manifestation, complications, co-morbidities, and sequela related to the condition were not included unless the described meaning of the code specifically referenced the condition defined, • Conditions and codes related to newborn or fetal anomalies were not included as a separate category for these conditions is planned, • Codes may be included in multiple condition categories if they meet the definition of the condition category.
